The table below gives some examples of the student's general ability at this level.

	Listening and Speaking	Reading and Writing
Overall general ability	CAN understand straightforward instructions or public announcements. CAN express opinions on abstract/ cultural matters in a limited way or offer advice within a known area.	CAN understand routine and unfamiliar information in written articles. CAN write letters or make notes on familiar or predictable matters.
Social & Tourist	CAN understand the main points of TV programmes on familiar and unfamiliar topics. CAN talk about things such as films and music, and describe his/her reactions to them.	CAN understand factual articles in magazines and letters from friends expressing personal opinions. CAN write to his/her friends about the books, music, and films that he/she likes.
School & Study	CAN understand instructions on classes and homework given by a teacher or lecturer. CAN understand lectures on unfamiliar topics. CAN repeat back what people say to check that he/she has understood. CAN paraphrase information he/she have just read and listened to. CAN give detailed practical instructions on how to do something he/she knows well.	CAN understand most information of factual nature in his/her school subjects and unfamiliar topics. CAN write a description of an event. CAN take basic notes in a lesson.

Suggested skills to review:

1. Conjugation and use of most common regular and irregular verbs
2. Use of connectors, adverbs, pronouns, adjectives, and nouns
3. Form and use of comparatives and superlatives
4. Form and use of simple and compound tenses
5. Reading comprehension strategies such as recognizing main ideas, purpose, and details; infer, and extract relevant information
